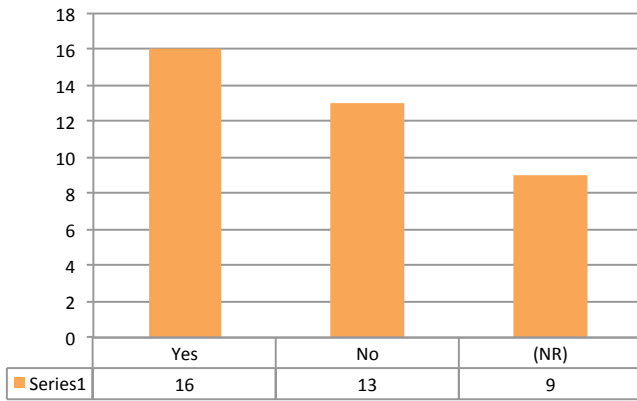

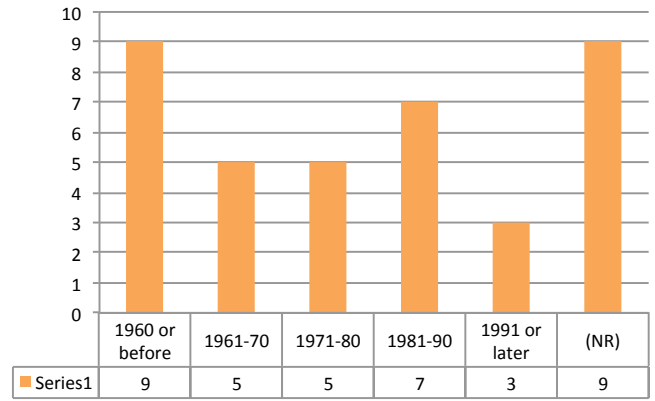

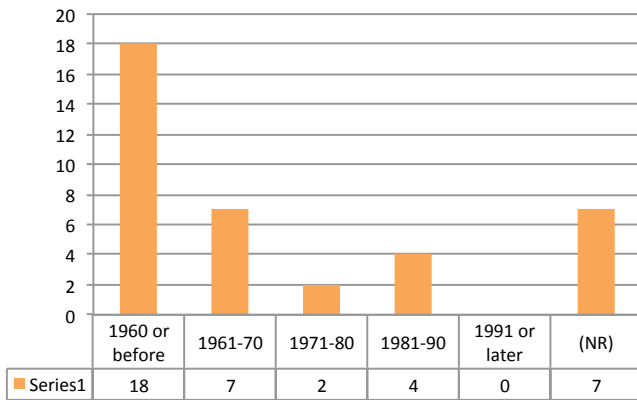
Question 1: Have you participated in a CitizenDetroit event before? (n=29)



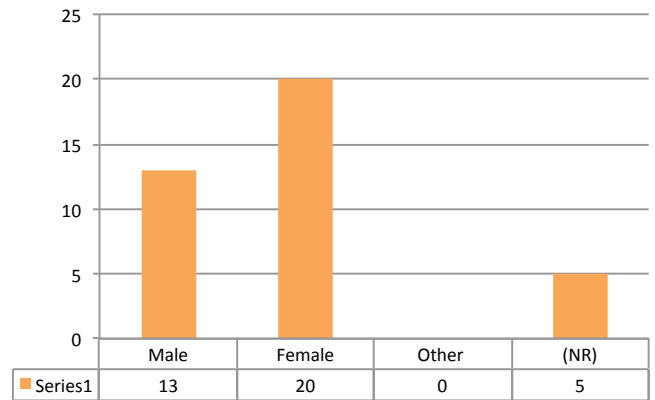
Question 2: I have lived in Detroit since... (n=29)



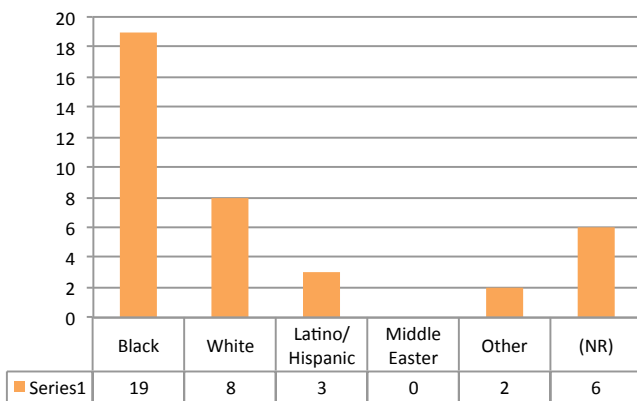
Question 3: I was born in... (n=31)



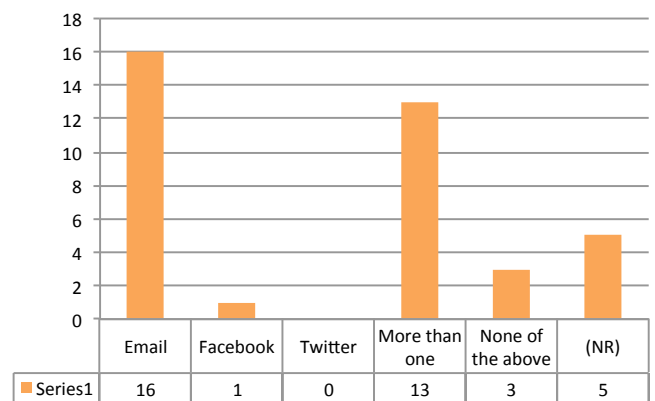
Question 4: My gender is... (n=33)



Question 6: I consider myself... (n=32)

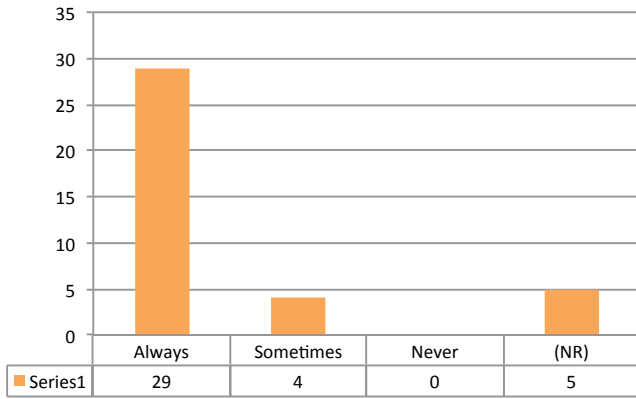


Question 7: Which of the following do you use regularly? (n=33)

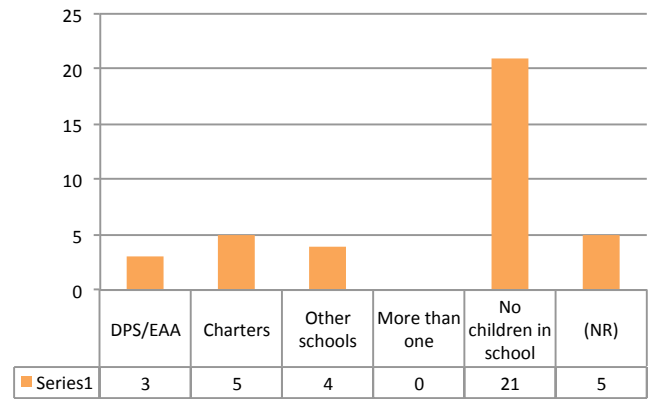

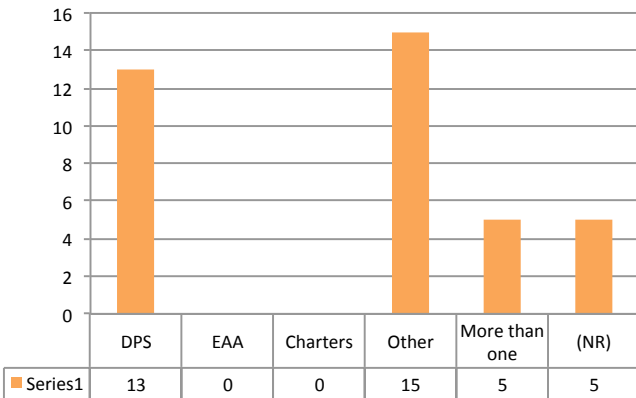
Question 7: Do you vote in primaries? (n=33)



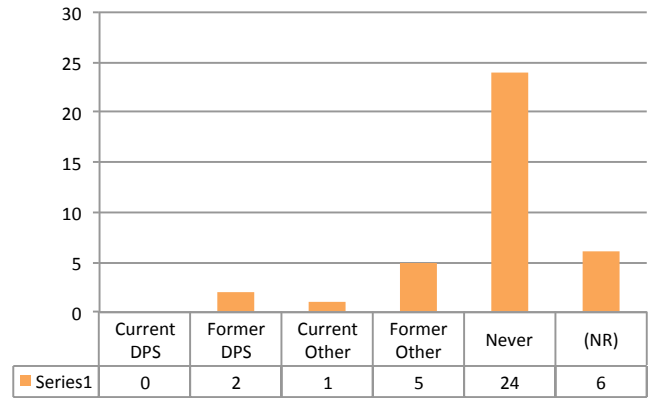
Question 8: I currently have children (or grandchildren) in... (n=33)



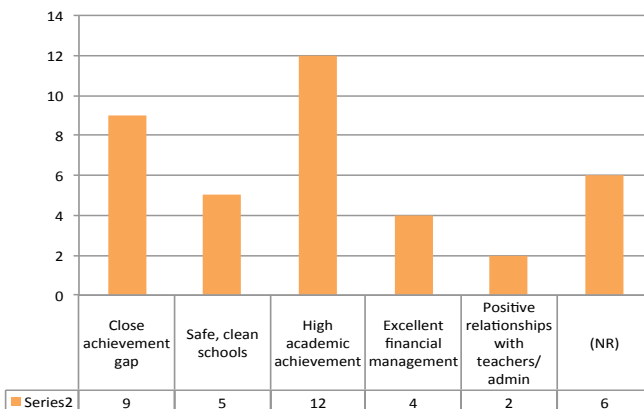
Question 9: I myself was educated in... (n=54)



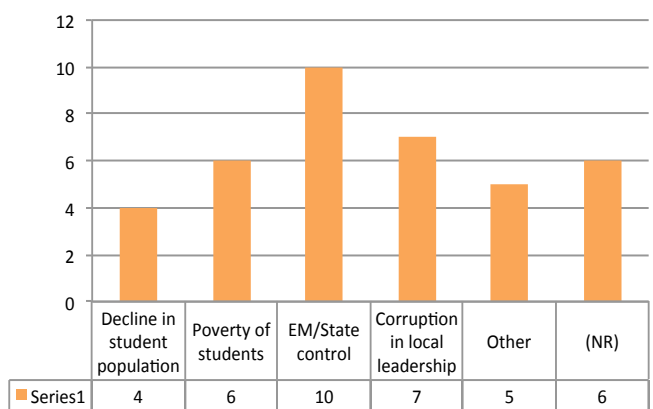
Question 10: Are you a teacher? (n=54)



Question 11: What should be the new DPS Superintendent's top priority? (n=32)

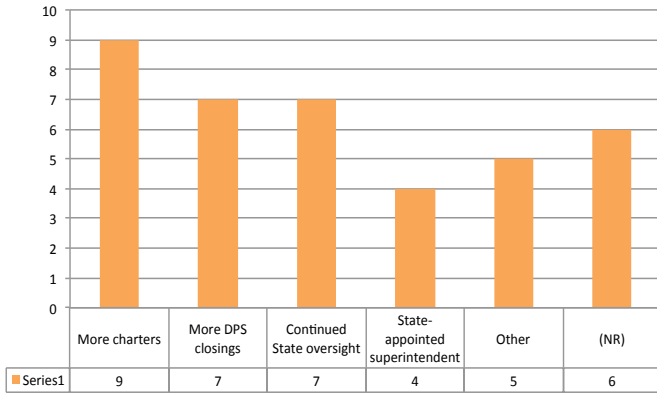


Question 12: What is the top challenge facing Detroit Public Education? (n=32)

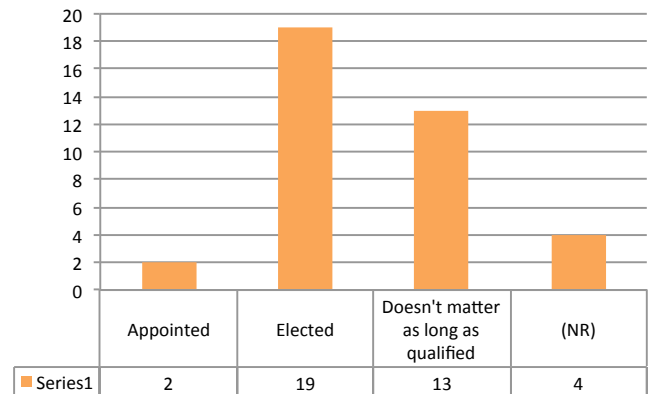

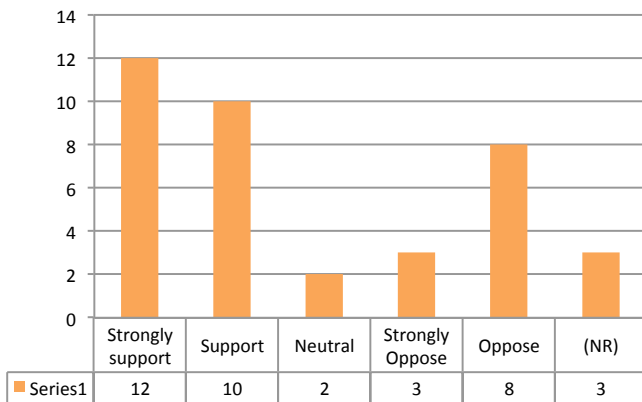
Question 13: I do NOT want to see... (n=34)



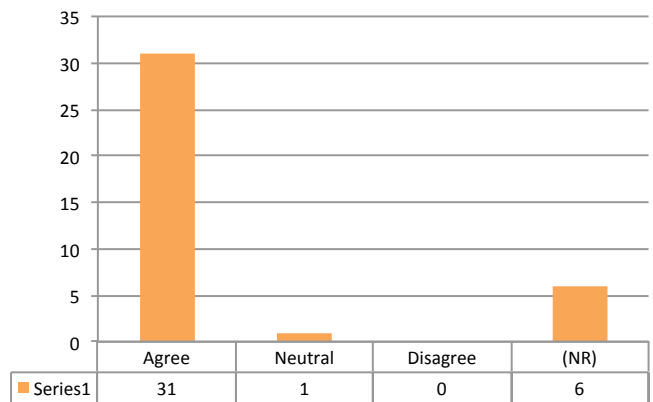
Question 14: The new DPS School Board should be... (n=34)



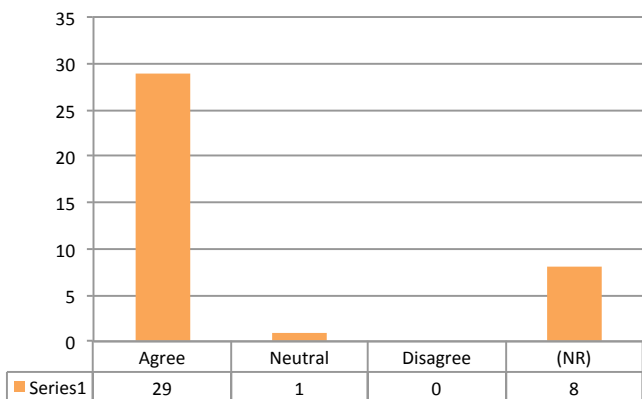
Question 15: What is your opinion on the DPS teacher sickouts? (n=35)



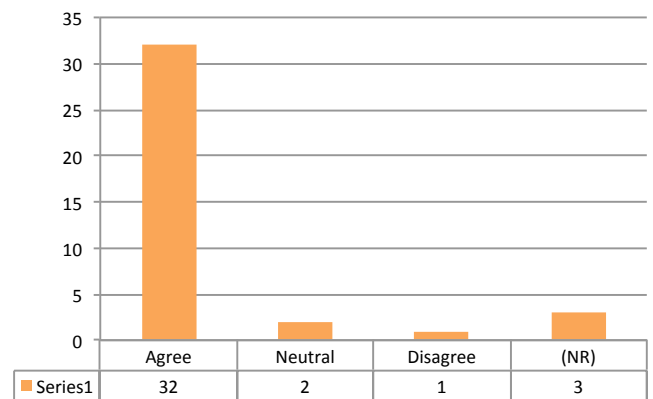
Question 16: I plan to vote in 2016. (n=32)
